Putting out the *Commotion*

Mark 5:22-24 Then one of the synagogue rulers, named Jairus, came there. Seeing Jesus, he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, "My little daughter is dying. Please come and put your hands on her so that she will be healed and live."

So Jesus went with him. A large crowd followed and pressed around him.

Five things about Jairus

1. He was a man of importance

2. He was a learned man

3. He was a rich man

4. He was a man who had a faith in God

5. He had a tender heart

v25-28 And a woman was there who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years. She had suffered a great deal under the care of many doctors and had spent all she had, yet instead of getting better she grew worse. When she heard about Jesus, she came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, because she thought, "If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed."

Three things about this lady

1. She could have given up

2. She could have made excuses

3. She had persistence

Four Stages he must have gone through.

1. The stage of hopelessness

2. The stage of hope

3. The stage of peace

4. The stage of faith

v35-39 While Jesus was still speaking, some men came from the house of Jairus, the synagogue ruler. “Your daughter is dead,” they said. “Why bother the teacher any more?” Ignoring what they said, Jesus told the synagogue ruler, “Don’t be afraid; just believe.”

He did not let anyone follow him except Peter, James and John the brother of James.

When they came to the home of the synagogue ruler, Jesus saw a commotion, with people crying and wailing loudly. He went in and said to them, “Why all this commotion and wailing? The child is not dead but asleep.”

v40 But they laughed at him. After he put them all out,

Colossians 2:10 ‘For in Christ Jesus you have been made complete.’
